



There is now a [webpage](#) and [eventbrite](#) registration form. Hopefully, the Genexis course will be a resource for churches and organisations to reach out to individuals on the margins, by exploring evidence for a creator from science, philosophy and history and inviting individuals to discuss and develop their own viewpoints in discussion groups. To engage with folks who have otherwise discounted faith and church and equipping and emboldening existing believers to humbly respond to the searching questions of this time. A simple, practical and profound course that the majority of people will enjoy participating in.

Speakers include Justin Brierley (host of '[Unbelievable](#)' on Premier Radio) who has interviewed many leading Christian and Atheist thinkers over the last 13 years, and Dr Andy Bannister who is the [Director of SOLAS Centre for Public Christianity](#), frequent public speaker and [author](#). A number of further speakers will also be announced very soon.

The course will be happening on Zoom, at 8pm on Monday evenings from the 5th October. It will run for seven Mondays, concluding on November 16th.

Virtual Carol Concert.

Kenilworth Lions will be producing a pre-recorded Virtual Carol Concert to run on YouTube on the Saturday before Christmas, as of course they cannot run the usual Abbey Fields event.

They are in contact with a choir master who can blend individual voices into a performance via his App – see an example https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=tKqLJP_g2Vk

They are hoping to find enough individual volunteers representing the local churches and various choirs to make a virtual choir of at least 10 singers who would sing in unison. The separate recordings for each carol would be blended together by a sound engineer. There would also be the usual readings, the Salvation Army and a performance from a local school.

Each singer would download the app, provided by the Lions, and then record themselves on a smart phone singing along to guide track (also provided) which would be inaudible on their recording. The choir master blends them into a performance and, if necessary, he can also work some magic and help voices sound in tune. The singer doesn't have to be seen on the video if they really don't want to be. APCM and Revision of the Electoral Roll

The Bishop has recently given permission for annual church meetings (APCMs) to be held remotely by Zoom.

We will be holding our **APCM at 19:30 on Monday 19 October 2020.**

Details of how to join the meeting will be sent via email shortly before the meeting.

This will be a short meeting via Zoom to cover the formal requirements of the APCM, including receiving the annual report for 2019 and electing new PCC members, Deanery Synod members and churchwardens.

We are hoping to be able to hold a more expansive annual meeting in person around April-time next year.

The church wardens are elected each year, PCC members are elected every three years (on a rotation basis), and Deanery Synod members are elected every three years.

This year for election there are:-

2 vacancies for church wardens , 5 vacancies for PCC members, 5 vacancies for Deanery Synod members

If you would like to stand as a church warden, deputy church warden, PCC member, or Deanery Synod member please speak to one of the leadership team or an existing PCC member to find out more about the role and then complete the relevant application form. Forms are available from the PCC Secretary (Kevin Dowle) or Denise.

If you are already on the electoral roll, you don't need to do anything, as we only do a completely new list once every 5 years, but...


